### About Our Guest Speaker

Patrick Ray is a Senior Project Manager with Brasfield & Gorrie, LLC whose current assignment is overseeing the construction of the Omni Louisville Hotel & Residences.

Brasfield & Gorrie, one of the nation’s largest privately held construction firms, is headquartered in Birmingham, AL and is the general contractor for the Omni Louisville project.

Patrick earned a Bachelor of Science in Construction Science and Management with a minor in Business Administration from Clemson University, and a Masters Degree in Construction Science from Georgia Tech.

After working as a summer co-op for Brasfield during college, Patrick accepted a job offer from the company upon his graduation and has worked for B&G since that time. He began his career at B&G as an estimator, but the company quickly moved him to the project management track, with a focus on multi-family and office/retail commercial construction. For seven years, Patrick worked in Atlanta building construction projects ranging in contract size from \$3MM to \$300MM. In 2013, he accepted an offer from Brasfield to move to Cincinnati and manage the construction of the Banks Phase II / GE Global projects on Cincinnati’s riverfront. In the fall of 2015, following the successful Cincinnati venture, he was then asked to move to Louisville to oversee the construction of the Omni Louisville Hotel & Residences.
